These are **Countable Nouns**

- You can count them
- They take the plural form
- You use many/few/fewer/**some***



1 Book

I am reading a book. There were few books left in the shop.



3 Cars

Three cars were involved in the accident. There are fewer cars on the road today.



2 Eyes

I have two eyes. Many eyes are watching you.



4 Potatoes

Boil four potatoes and mash them. We need some potatoes too.

These are **Uncountable Nouns**

- You cannot count them
- They do not take the plural form
- You use **some***/a lot/less/much



Ice

Please put some ice into the glass.



Bread

He eats less bread these days.



Hair

The baby has a lot of hair.



Information

We do not have much information about the earthquake.

*Some can be used for both countable and uncountable nouns.

The Words in Bold are **Countable**



2 Blocks of Ice

There are two **blocks** of ice in the freezer.



4 Strands of Hair

The police found four **strands** of hair belonging to the victim.



3 Slices of Ham

He ate three **slices** of ham in one go.



A Piece of Information

We received a **piece** of information that was crucial to solving the case.

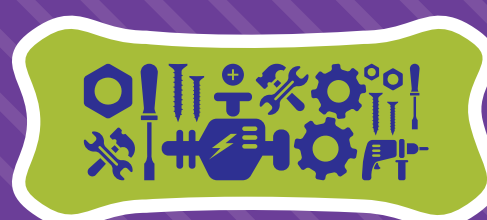

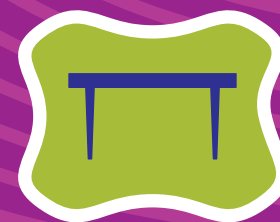

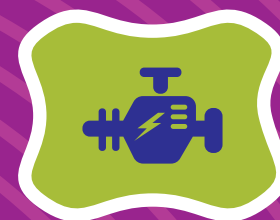
